Dear Parent/Guardian:

Welcome to school. Please refer to the information listed below for the approved dress code that applies to North Lakeland Elementary School:

**TOPS: White, Navy or Hunter Green shirt with collar or school t-shirt with North Lakeland Elementary School Logo:**

- Shirts must have long or short sleeves.
- Shirts must be solid colored, knit polo-type, woven oxford dress shirt or cotton blouse.
- Only school t-shirts, available through our school office, are permitted to be worn.
- Undershirts **MUST** be in school colors (HUNTER GREEN, NAVY BLUE OR WHITE) *and worn under school approved 2-3 button style Polo shirt or school t-shirt.*

**BOTTOMS: Black, Navy or Khaki/Tan:**

- Walking shorts, Slacks, Skorts and Skirted Jumpers must be plain solid Black, Navy or Khaki/Tan colored twill. *Blue jean/denim fabric bottoms have been removed from the uniform at North Lakeland Elementary.*

**Other dress code rules:**

- A belt is required if the garment has belt loops.
- All shirts must be tucked in.
- Shorts, skorts, skirts and jumpers must be mid-thigh in length or longer.
- Shoes must be closed toe and closed heel.
- Clothes must be appropriate size, with waist of garment worn at student's waist.
- Clothing that is too tight or too loose is not appropriate for school.
- **Sweatshirts WITHOUT hoods are acceptable.**

**School administrators will determine if clothing is appropriate for school and complies with district rules.** For more specific information on the student dress code, please refer to the Polk County Public Schools Code of Student Conduct.
